Always ask: WHY?

Intercultural communication and the supervision of voluntary services By Maximilian Engl

I returned from my two voluntary with a wealth of new impressions each time; by far too many to convey them in a few sentences to those who had stayed at home. Instead, I experienced how my concrete experiences from this period assumed a personal character. The impressions had literally pressed themselves into my biography, where they constitute an essential part of my personality. But WHY have these impressions sometimes depressed me but couldn't press me down completely?

The central task within the supervision of volunteers before, during and after their stay abroad is to offer a consistent framework in which people can learn to get aware and to form their communication and processing patterns. In the intercultural communication training, the focus is increasingly on the concept we have of the foreign. And the point is WHY we are able to have such a concrete image of something we don't know.

And, afterwards, loaded with so many experiences: WHY did it go off this way and WHY did the local people behave the way they did – and WHY wasn't I able but to exactly react the way I did? Sometimes, the unremitting question for the WHY is as tiring as the intercultural encounters themselves can time and again be. But it also leads to a better understanding of the origin of one's own view of things. This is because on the way to the other I must get past myself – there, where impressions imprint themselves.

Going. Beginning. A departure. The first steps. And, finally, it starts. There is euphoria, energy and so much desire. However, already at the beginning: A huge STOP sign. Why, you are asking yourself, do I take such a lot of trouble? And: Will I tough this out? What follows is hard to describe in words, a new world, so much that you are often not able to catch it. Excessive demand, learning, injecting oneself, ups and downs. Becoming part of a whole. You dare more. And: who dares wins. It shows up from out of nowhere: A big stumbling block. But you make another attempt ... and: you've done it! Afterwards: Deceleration, being free, happiness. And all this as a permanent condition. Hopefully it will stay like that, for good - the better. From the very far distance: a babel of voices. But the foreigners are talking in a language you don't understand and you continue dancing You start to run, against the course of time, you are stopped. You lose yourself....

... when you wake up next time you are standing there all alone. The foreign voices are closing in on you, are tugging and pulling at you. A real test? Your eyes are looking for the mirror, but there is nobody to help you with your search. Suddenly, it shows up from out of nowhere, very small, however, caught in a rainbow bubble. You recognize your mirror image inside the bubble, you try to touch it, want to be close to it. However, it continues to rise up into the sky, moves away from you. You reach out your arms for it, but are held back by the foreign crowd surrounding you. You are pushed onto a new path. Walking. Beginning. A departure, it dawns on you. Not without me, the bubble whispers. And you stop to look up to it ... You see yourself shouting out loudly. But nobody hears you. Where do you want to go?. you ask, is that all about us now? And... when do we meet again? Around you: steps, a babel
